Course Objectives and Course Goals

As a continuation of the writing instruction and practice begun in ENG 131, English 132 emphasizes critical thinking, academic research, and forms of writing useful to academic, professional, and personal life. Required units of study include argumentation and analysis. Learners should expect to achieve proficiency with Modern Language Association (MLA) style and conventions. Requirements include participation in discussions, course activities, and a portfolio. Standard English grammar and structures are requisite skills in this course.
